

# Famous sightseeing spots near Yu~Yu~ Bus stops

**Bus Stop 4 Omiyanomatsu**  
**Jacaranda (June)**  
 Purple flowers resembling tufts of grapes bloom. There are more than 100 trees along the footpath from the "Jacaranda Promenade," (disembark at Omiyanomatsu) in Higashi-kaigancho along National Route 135, to the Shinsui-Koen (Atami Water Park) in Nagisacho. There are also trees in the water park.

**Bus Stop 4 Omiyanomatsu**  
**Statue of Kan-ichi and Omiya**  
**Omiyanomatsu**  
 Atami became known around Japan in the Meiji Period (1868-1912) thanks to Kyo Ozaki's novel "The Golden Demon (Konjiki Yasha)," which was published in the Yomiuri Shinbun newspaper. There is a bronze statue depicting the well-known "farewell on the Atami coast" scene from the story, and next to this you can find Omiya-no-matsuri pine trees.  
 \*Stone monument for Konjiki Yasha (0 min walk)

**Bus Stop 5 Sunbeach**  
**Atami Sunbeach**  
 With blue water, white sands and rows of palm trees, the beach has an atmosphere resembling a foreign resort. It's lit up in blue during the evening.

 \*Kawara-yu (Atami Seven Hot Springs) (2 min walk)  
 \*Sajiro-no-yu (Atami Seven Hot Springs) (5 min walk)  
 \*Seizamon-no-yu (Atami Seven Hot Springs) (5 min walk)

**Bus Stop 6 Ginza**  
**Shinsui Park Moon Terrace**  
 Surrounded by the flowers of the season, it's a recommended spot for those who wish to relax while feeling a comfortable ocean breeze. Perfect for walks, day and night.

**Bus Stop 6 Ginza**  
**Itogawa Promenade**  
 Early-blooming "Atami Cherry Blossom" can be seen here from January to early February, and in the sea. \*Wearing of life jackets is a requirement as of February 1, 2018.

 Enjoy the view of Atami Port while traveling to the Ropeway Sanroku Station from the Marine Spa ATAMI bus stop. A three minute walk through the skies will take you to the Ajo Cape observation deck. The Atami Adult Museum and Atami Castle can also be reached with two to three minutes of walking.

**Bus Stop 9 Nishikigaura**  
**Nishikigaura**  
 A scenic precipice that continues on for about 2 kilometers from Uomisaki, which is located slightly south of Atami City. With a height of about 80 meters, the islands of Hatsushima and Oshima, along with rocks carved out by rough waves, can be seen.

**Atami Hihoukan**  
 Take a three minute walk through the skies with the ropeway and you will reach an amusement park for adults! A two-minute walk from Atami Castle, over 30 alluring attractions will invite you into a world of fantasy.

**Bus Stop 13 Kiunkaku Nishiguchi**  
**Kiunkaku**  
 Kiunkaku features a verdant garden spread over grounds with an area of 2.5 acre, and Japanese and Western-style buildings filled with the romance and style of the Taisho and Showa era. This historic building has been a subject of affection for many great Japanese literary figures, including Yuzo Yamamoto and Osamu Dazai.

 This is where geiko (entertainers) rigorously practice and rehearse, and it was built in 1954. "Hana no Ma" (flower dance) is performed each Saturday and Sunday. Take this opportunity to watch a dance by professional entertainers.

 This old geyser was one of the most well known artisan springs in the world. It has been redeveloped and is now an artificial geyser.
